Webinar on Crime Free Bharat

On 22nd September 2020, the Online Webinar on Crime Free Bharat was organized by The Computer Society of India (CSI) - SVCE Student Chapter 2020-2021 and the Department of Information Technology in the presence of our esteemed chief guest Mr. Maithili Sharan Gupta, Director General of Police (Police Reforms), Madhya Pradesh. The webinar began with the welcome address rendered by Ms. Preethika, Joint-Treasurer of CSI, and was hosted by Rahul RK, the Chairman of CSI.

Dr. V. Vidhya, Student Branch Counselor of CSI, delivered a short note about the Computer Society of India and the Department of Information Technology. She expressed her gratitude towards the chief guest for accepting to sign an official Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with our college. She talked a few words about the MoU and its significance to the students of SVCE.

Dr. T. Sukumar, Associate Professor, Department of Information Technology, welcomed the chief guest Mr. Gupta, and the audience who had gathered.
