#### 8. Description:

On Day 1, the NSS volunteers of both units I (FU) and II (SFU) assembled on 18th March at the open air auditorium of our college. Dr.A.Anandavadivel,Sr.PO elaborated to the volunteers about NSS camp activities. He gave an overview of activities to be carried out at the two camping places viz Nemili (Unit-I) and Mannur(Unit-II). The importance of safety during camping period and the conservation of water during this harsh summer and the judicious use of food are emphasized. The 5 mission as target to the groups to work viz., education mission, environmental mission, literacy mission, social work and cleanliness are assigned. Unit-I volunteers started the survey in Nemili village and distributed pamphlet of NSS camp to create awareness to the villagers. On Day 2, the forenoon session of the camp was preoccupied with a discourse on meditation by Sri. Easwaran of Bramhakumaris Meditation centre, Sriperumbudur. He expounded the importance of having positive thoughts while weeding out negative thoughts in order to have focus of mind to ensure success in all our endeavors. In afternoon session, a group of volunteers educated school children vigorously while another group embarked on the literacy mission so that they can enable people who cannot sign are identified and educated to sign by their own fingers. On Day 3, the major activities are planting tree saplings in individual houses and educating the school children on hygiene. The houses where sapling is going to be planted are first identified later saplings were planted. A group of volunteers educated school children while another group embarked on the literacy mission In addition, volunteers went around the village proclaiming the health camp through the megaphone.On Day 4, the health checkup for the villagers of Nemili was arranged. With the arrival of three member medical team, the NSS volunteers guided the public through the health checkup process. The blood pressure of the villagers are recorded and a doctor thoroughly scrutinized each and every patient and medicines were issued free of cost to the public. On Day 5, a group of volunteers rendered their services to accomplish five missions by inculcate the need of education, cleaning temple premises, pond premises and school fencing, spreading lime or bleaching powder in dirty streets/places.On Day 6, a group of volunteers demonstrated medical hand wash to school children and continued to render their services to accomplish their missions where they left on yesterday. Later, the volunteers donated writing table to the Govt. Middle school, Nemelli on account of gratitude for various support to NSS scheme rendered from the

village. The white wash to the school entrance has been done in the school premises. On Day 7, the valedictory function was held on the last day of the camp with Dr. S GaneshVaidhayanathan, Principal of our college. Dr.A.Ananadavadivel, Sr. PO welcomed &narrated the camp activities at length and about the transformation the special annual camp bring upon the personalities of camp participants. Then, the Principal extolled the services rendered by NSS volunteers during the camp and exhorted them to apply technology to problems faced by villagers in a cost effective and simplistic manner. The NSS special annual camp of Unit-II(SF) was conducted at TLC Primary School, Mannur, Sriperumbudur. The NSS volunteers are accompanied and guided by two program officers Dr. R.Karthikeyan, Associate Professor & Dr.R.Umadevi, Assistant Professor, Applied Mathematics. After the lunch camp-II (SF) departed to Mannur village. PO-NSS R.Karthikeyan explained in detail the series of activities to be carried out as per the pamphlet released from the camp. With the help of lead and senior volunteers various committees were formed. These committees are formed apart from the groups to achieve the sixtargets. The planning of village survey was carried out with the outlining of the process and various survey groups were earmarked. Thereafter, the head master of the TLC school was felicitated by way of garlanding. She also appreciated the service of erstwhile NSS volunteers who camped at the same place two years ago. The forenoon session of the second day of the camp was preoccupied with a discourse on meditation by Sri. Easwaran of Bramhakumaris meditation center, Sriperumbudur. He expounded the importance of having positive thoughts while weeding out negative thoughts in order to have focus of mind to ensure success in all our endeavors. In the afternoon session volunteers embarked in ten groups to carry out the following tasks.(1)House to house village survey as stipulated in the NSS manual,(2)Distribution of NSS camp pamphlet door to door.(3)To invite the household for the forthcoming health camp in the NSS camp,(4)To carry out the UBA – Unnath Bharath Abiyan survey in the prescribed format. The refreshments are served to the volunteers to rejuvenate themselves. The forenoon session of the third day of the camp housed the health checkup for the villagers of Mannur. The volunteers went around the village proclaiming the health camp through the megaphone. With the arrival of three member medical team, the NSS volunteers guided the public for the health checkup process. The doctors thoroughly scrutinized each and every patient and medicines are issued free of cost to the public. Thirty one villagers benefitted through this camp. This was followed by the health checkup of school children of TLC primary school as well. The school children were issued health cards by the govt. medical officials. Post lunch session to the volunteers went on a house to house campaign of educating the hygiene measures for healthier living. A section of volunteers embarked on educating the school children. Another section serviced the defunct computer in the school and made it operational successfully. On the fifth day of the camp the activities are planting tree saplings in individual houses and educating the school children on hygiene. The volunteers were divided into two groups; each group will plant five saplings at earmarked places. The groups journeyed to the far side of the village and planted the saplings. A group of volunteers educated school children vigorously the entire day while another group embarked on the literacy mission so that they can enable people who cannot sign.

After arriving at a plan of action one group went on removing acacia growth inside the temple which is quite an arduous and gargantuan task. The second group started cleaning the temple& surroundings wher full of fallen leaves present. The female volunteers undertook the task of cleaning the main premise leading to the door of sanctum of the temple. After completion of these task lunch was served. In Post lunch session the Head Master of the school was invited and on behalf of the NSS unit, a good quality writing table was presented to the school. The NSS volunteers presented a writing pad to the school children. As the school computer was devoid of a speaker system, which proscribed the teachers to show multimedia content to students, the volunteers donated a speaker system and made it operational. Some of the volunteers donated books to the school library.

A part of interaction our Principal invited NSS volunteers to share their experiences which was readily complied by two volunteers from each camp. High tea was served and the camp came to an end with National anthem.
