



Karthikeyan, PO-NSS delivered the welcome address and introduced the volunteers and the agenda of the camp. The chief guest in his poignant address exhorted the NSS volunteers to apply the technology to the rural downtrodden people and emphasized that the special annual camp is an ideal platform for the same. Further, Dr. A. Ananadavadivel, Sr.PO_ explained at length the spirit behind NSS camp and how students can expect a transformation at the end of camp. After the food time the importance of village survey and the various aspects of the village survey are explained and assigned to the volunteers. Twenty eight village women benefitted through this training and this has to make the women SHG to be selfsufficient through their earning by their products. In the afternoon session students embarked on village survey. The NSS volunteers are asked to take the village survey. The crux of the survey indicated that diabetes is the prevalent disease of the village and the village lacked dustbins for garbage collection. On 12/02/2020-Day Three Various mission activities are started, among the groups of volunteers. The health care mission group embarked on demonstrating the hygienic hand wash procedure to village households. The education mission group helped in the education of school children especially in the understanding of English grammar and the literacy mission group tried to identify people who cannot sign and embarked on the mission of educating them at least to sign. The sanitation mission group identified the areas where sanitation procedures to be implemented The swachh mission group went on to identify areas which require cleaning especially temples and places of worship. The environmental mission group went house to house to educate the importance of keeping the environment clean and also identified the houses where saplings will be planted. After the lunch, Swachh mission group cleaned two temples viz, 1) Gangai amman temple 2) Musili amman temple .On 13/02/2020-DayFour in the camp the the following three events are focused: (i) Special Lecture on social entrepreneurship (ii) Tree plantation in the house holds of the village and (iii) Cleaning of school campus.
