



Report on "Contribution of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose in freedom fighting"

(23rd January 2021)

NCC (Army) cadets of Sri Venkateswara College of Engineering, Sriperumbudur organised a webinar on "Contribution of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose in freedom fighting" under the guidance of ANO Capt. Dr. A. Bhaskaran on 23rd January 2021. Around 41 army cadets and 36 air wing cadets had participated in the webinar. V.Rajaram, NCC Air Wing care taker had participated in the webinar.

Around 1810 hrs Sgt.V.Rajarajan initiated his presentation by explaining the Early life, Political life of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. Then Cpl. R.Kaviyaran explained Netaji's contribution for the formation of Indian National Army (INA), Rani of Jhansi regiment and end of INA.

Later Cdt.B.Kavin stepped into the Holwell Monument, Prison life, Repatriation to India and Red Fort Trial. Finally Cdt. V.Santossh explained Netaji's visit to England, disappearance of Netaji and theories behind it.

INDIAN NATIONAL ARMY

- ✓ The Indian National Army (INA) or **Azad Hind Fauj** was an armed force formed by Indian nationalists in 1942 in South-East Asia during World War II.
- ✓ The aim of the army was to liberate India from the British occupation with Japanese assistance.
- ✓ Initially composed of Indian prisoners of war captured by Japan in the Malayan campaign.
- ✓ The Rani of Jhansi regiment was formed as an all volunteer women's unit to fight the British occupiers as well as provide medical services to the INA.



DISAPPEARANCE

- ✓ Although it was believed that Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose died in a plane crash, his body was never recovered.
- ✓ There have so many theories been put forward regarding his abrupt desertion. The government of India set up a number of committees to investigate the case and come out with truth.
- ✓ In May, 1956, the Shah Nawaz Committee visited Japan to look into the situation of Bose's assumed death.
