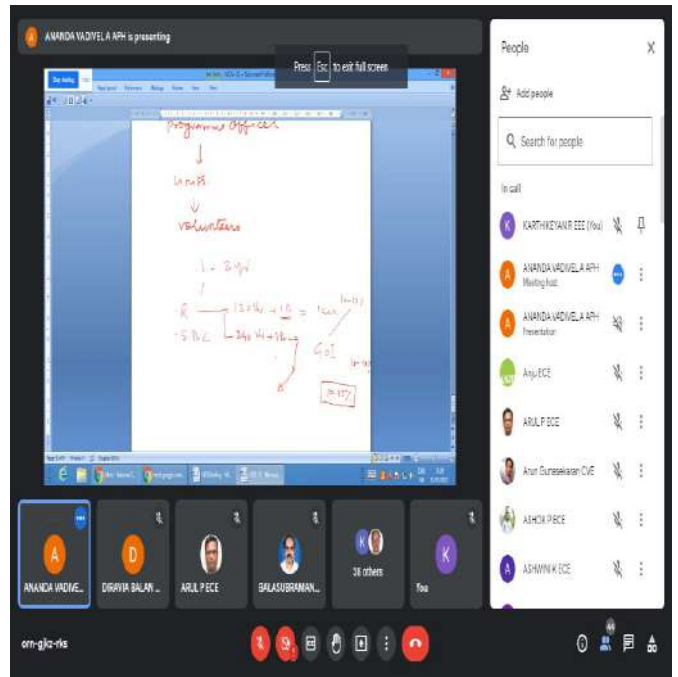
The event was arranged to implement NSS program among the volunteers, Heads of departments, i/c of sections, and faculty members to understand the regulations and government instruction on NSS program in general and Choice Based Credit system (CBCS) in particular. This program was held on 31/1/2021 through Google Meet -Online mode. Forty five people participated in the program with all stakeholders. Dr. A. Anandavadivel , Sr.PO-NSS welcome the attendees and proceeded to explain the brief history of NSS, its objective , Enrollment process in NSS and number of hours of service to be rendered, its modalities to obtain the NSS certificates etc.. Sr.PO-NSS informed that during the tenure of NSS (I & II years) a student **cannot be a** member of any other services/activity to get Govt. certificate/any credentials. Once He /she finishes at least first year service in NSS, they are eligible to get 120 hrs of Government certificate. Now by doing it so the student naturally full fills 80hrs of requirement to complete the course in CBCS system. As CBCS system requires 80 hours of service in any one of extracurricular activities of students to fulfill the requirement of qualify to the B.E/B. Tech degree. If any volunteers does not reach the requirement can involve in Public Services (PS) viz. Hospital (government), Post office, schools (government only),banks(Nationalized only) and produce 80 hours of service rendered in a statement / certificate from competent authority where they serve under PS. NSS office has directed the volunteers to follow the procedures by referring the NSS –portal from the college WEB site.

Sr. PO also clarified various queries from the Heads of the departments, CoE and the Principal. Principal finally concluded that without jeopardizing the NSS regulation from Ministry of Youth affairs and sports Govt. of India. the defaulters must comply the regulation to complete service which has to be endorsed by the NSS office and then ensured by Heads of the departments for final approbation by the Controller of Examinations.

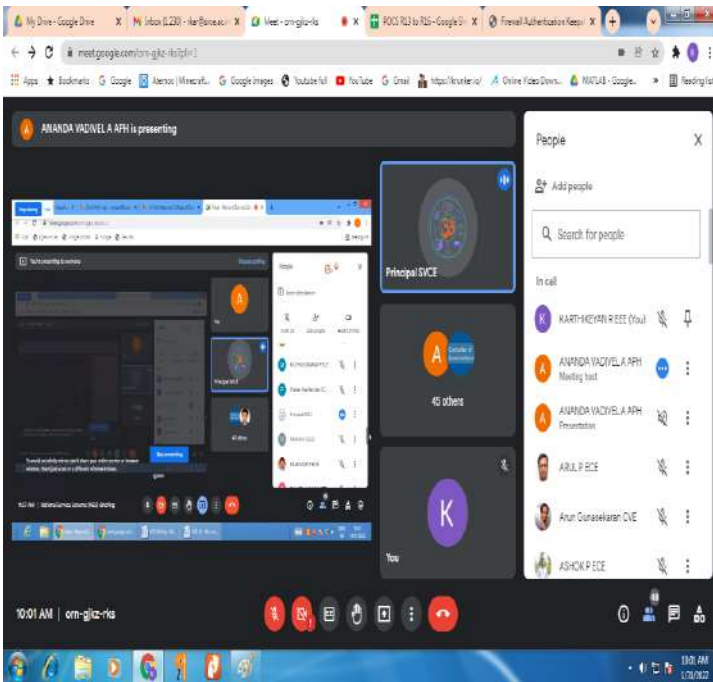

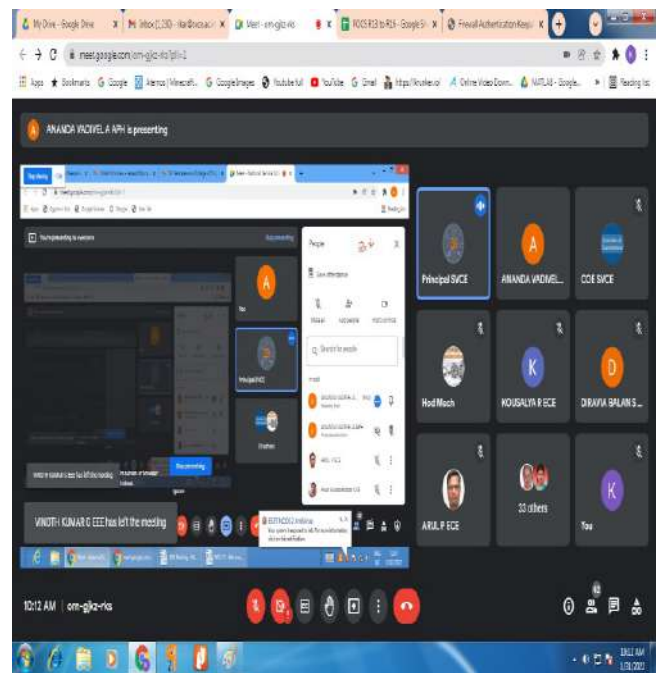

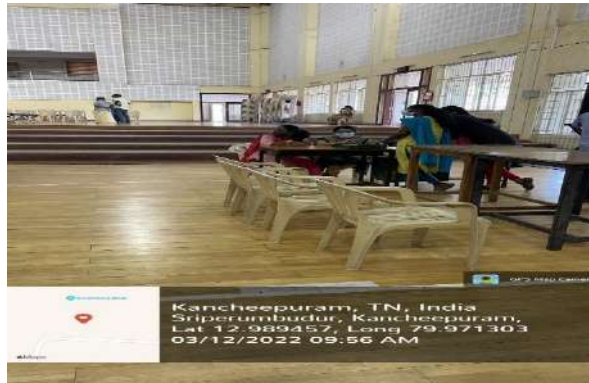

The inaugural function of seven days NSS annual special camp was held on 21/2/2022, at 10 AM. Prof. Dr.S. Ganesh Vaidhyanathan, Principal, Sri Venkateswara College of Engineering graced the occasion as the chief guest. The school headmistress, Assistant Educational Officer and dignitaries of the Irungkattukottai Panchayat are present. Dr.A.Anandavadivel, Sr. PO of NSS, welcome the NSS volunteers and introduced the agenda of the camp in detail and explained at length the spirit behind NSS camp and how it is going to change the student's attitude /transformation in behavior at the end of the camp. The Professor also outlined the rules to be adhered during the camp days. The chief guest in his address exhorted the NSS volunteers to apply the technology to develop the social transformation, social life of rural people and emphasized that the special annual camp is an ideal platform for the same. In the afternoon session, the senior programme officer formed the six mission groups to carry out the NSS events and explained the importance and various aspects of village survey in both the units. As a prelude to the village survey the NSS volunteers distributed the event pamphlets of the camp in the villages. The unit-2 has been retained in Irungkattukottai village and Unit-1 taken to Paruthipattu village.

On Day: 2 in pre Lunch session volunteers identified the places where watering is required for existing sapling. All volunteers poured sufficient water to the plants. In the afternoon the village self-help group women are trained by Mrs. Banumathy Trainer of cottage Industry from NGO to prepare soap powder, soap oil, phenyl and Dasangame powder etc....

On third day, NSS volunteers cleaned the temple adjacent to the school, where camp has been housed. The medical camp was held in the afternoon session where second team was taking care in arranging

the medical examination. In the medical camp villagers were diagnosed for the symptoms of various diseases through blood tests and two Govt. medical officers from Head quarts Hospital, Maduramangalam assigned for the purpose are prescribed the medicines. Eye test was also done in the village and spectacles were prescribed by the optometrist and the cataract cases are asked to contact eye hospital. Medicines were distributed to the villagers to treat various ailments suffered. Around fifty villagers of the camp-1 benefitted through this medical camp.

On fourth day in the forenoon, the volunteers are divided into three groups with two groups engaged in the sapling plantation in houses which already identified by the environmental mission of volunteer team. The villagers cooperated well with the volunteers and assured that they will take care of the plants by way of regular watering and saving it from cattle. The third group involved in the swachh Bharath events of cleaning the school campus from plastics and other garbage and at the end of the strenuous activity the NSS volunteers collected four big bags full of garbages for destruction. In the afternoon session, NSS volunteers visited the Bramhakumaris Spiritual Centre located on the outskirts of Sriperumbudur. The centre in-charge welcome the volunteers and explained the objective of the centre and its main activities. Further, an audio-visual show on spirituality was screened to the volunteers followed by demonstration of spirituality through a series of posters from the center in-charge.

On sixth day in the forenoon session Dr T Sukumar, PO educated the school students with computers. NSS volunteers also took part in the event. Further, Prof Krishnan and Dr Kalidass, Asso. Prof & A HoD of Department of Marine Engineering, of our college are invited as guests for a session where the Fire and Extinguishers of fire was demonstrated.

In the camp –II at Irungattukottai village the following programmes are arranged

On the final day In the forenoon session of last day of the camp, valedictory function was held with the Prof. Ganesh Vaidhyanathan , Principal as the chief guest. The function started with invocation followed by the welcome address of Prof.A. Anadavadivel, Sr PO-NSS. 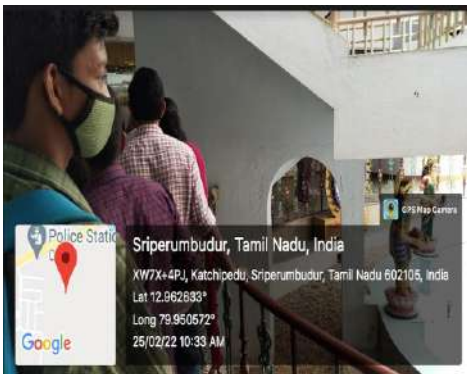
