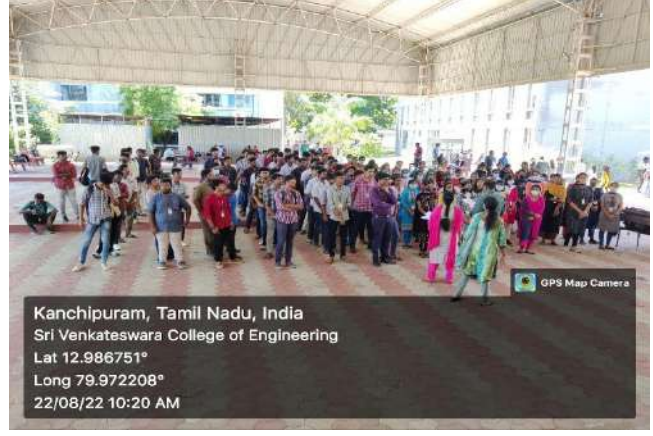
8. Description:

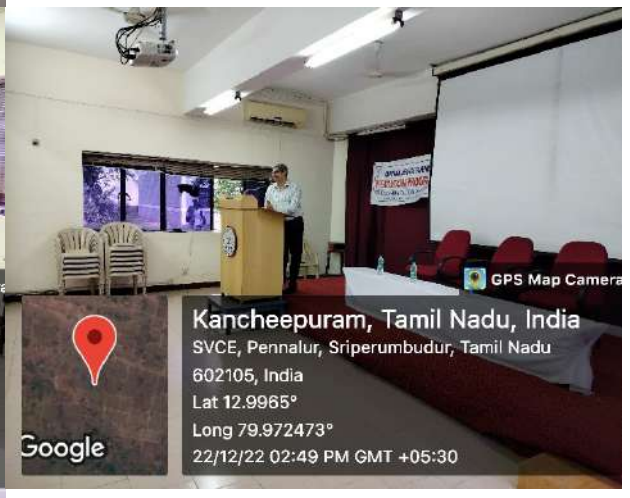
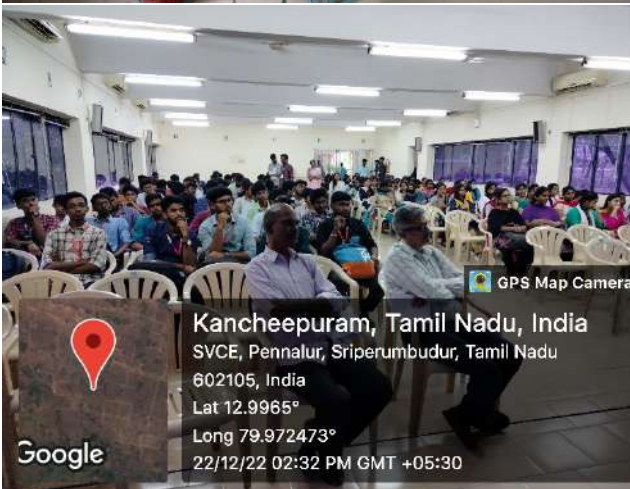
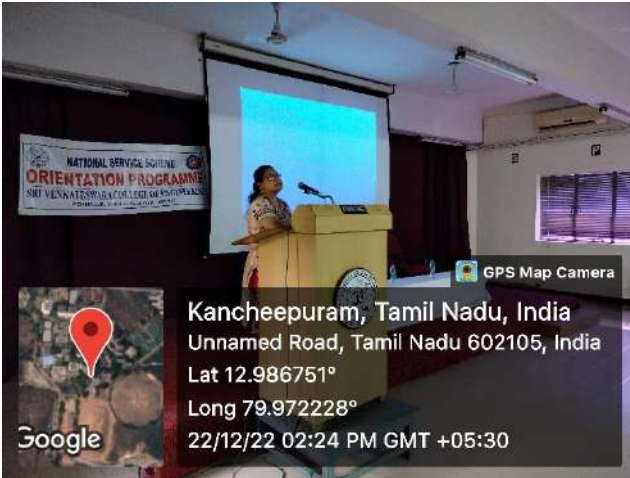

8. Description:

The camp started on 8th May 2023 at 9:00AM in Panchayat Union Elementary School Thandalam Village Tandalam. Sri T. E. Sasikumar Panchayat President, Thandalam village, Ms. Vijayalakshmi, Assistant Educational Officer, Sriperumbudur Block, Dr. J Venkatesan, Dean students affairs of our college, Ms. Helen, Elementary School Headmistress Thandalam village and Sr.PO-NSS, are present. The importance of the yearly NSS camp and the necessity of NSS operations in villages were explained by Sr. PO-NSS. Mr. T. E. Sasikumar, the village Panchayat Board President, highlighted the value of NSS programs and how different initiatives may improve the community. He also gave a promise that he would assist the NSS unit in his endeavors. Dean SW Prof. A Venkatesan also addressed volunteers. He was grateful for the volunteers and NSS units and their efforts. Further, AEO praised the Panchayat Board president for his honest efforts in helping Thandalam village prosper and urged the NSS volunteers to make a similar sincere effort. Later, The HM of the school addressed the volunteers and pleaded for outstanding service from them. A part of the volunteers those who are assigned with Pennalur village left to the camp-II.

In the afternoon session, all the volunteers participated in the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan(UBA) Survey, which sought to determine the resources that were available in the village and how they were being used. The issues identified in the village were consolidated by volunteers in the afternoon session.

In the forenoon session of second day of the camp, the yoga session was arranged. The program was executed by Professor Dr. NK Mohanty, Electrical and Electronics Engineering of our college where different Asanas and Pranayam are taught. He also taught how Asana helps to gain height, Vajrasana helps in digestion, Padmasana helps in stretching of muscles in the leg,

further He also explained the proper methodology to do breathing exercises and encouraged the volunteers to join the Yoga classes conducted by him in the college.

In the afternoon session, the volunteers created awareness among the villagers regarding sanitation and personal Hygiene. The people were made aware of stagnant water around the house which is the cause for mosquito breeding and spread of diseases like Malaria, Dengue etc, they were also taught the necessity of personal hygiene which includes washing hands frequently, brushing teeth twice a day and covering mouth and nose while coughing or sneezing. Apart from these awareness events Bleaching powder was spread over the streets of Thandalam village.

In the forenoon session of third day the firefighting demonstration and awareness was held. Instructions are provided by Dr. Sankar Assistant Professor, Department of Marine Engineering of our college. The event focusses on "how to extinguish different types of fire accidents." This instruction was provided to both general public as well as volunteers. The majority of the demonstration was dedicated to the various kinds of fire extinguishers.

In the afternoon session, village elementary school students were asked to join in the educational mission by learning of fundamental subjects taught by NSS volunteers. Hence the fundamentals of English language and grammar were taught to a sizeable portion of elementary school students. Students are given the opportunities to improve their communication skills through participation in this event.

The volunteers visited the village and assisted the people to who are lack of education. And members of the education mission was asked to take care of them. As a result of this literacy campaign, a significant number of individuals were able to acquire some fundamental knowledge with the assistance of our volunteers.

On the third day of the camp, in the forenoon session, the NSS volunteers are active in cleaning the temples. It became important to clear up the surplus debris and plant wastes that had accumulated in the place surrounding the temples. This happens to be necessary because of the surroundings had become unsanitary. In addition to this, it had become essential to clean the dust that had accumulated in the temples. Later, the volunteers started cleaning the Pond, which is located adjacent to the school, and the overall waste that was gathered was disposed in appropriate manner. In the afternoon session, the volunteers took part identifying the problems exist in Thandalam village. Later, volunteers form the team by themselves and discussed such problems and technical solutions to their problems are initiated. Further, an each team presented their technical solution to the programme officer. Finally, the best innovative idea was selected and volunteers are appreciated and assured to implement it in near future. In the forenoon session, of fourth day, the volunteers gathered for the creation of financial management awareness to the villagers so that they can plan and save money. It was determined that tobacco usage was rigorous in the village Hence, signboards, banners should be made available in the village.

In the afternoon session, of fifth day the volunteer are went to the Brama kumarikal Meditation Centre, Sriperumbudur. The center in-charge welcome the volunteers and explained the objective of the center and its main activities. Further, an audio-visual show on spirituality was displayed to the volunteers and also they provided some spiritual guidance to the volunteers to get rid of any unwanted beliefs that pre occupy their mind due to depression. They also emphasized, that how important it was to acknowledge the presence of the soul within the body as well as how essential it was to protect Mother Earth. The volunteers were also given information regarding the significance of meditation as well as the advantages that come with it. In the forenoon session, a

rally was held by the NSS volunteers at Thadalam village to create awareness on not to use tobacco and other substances. They also educated people on how to properly dispose of plastic and how improper disposal causes harmful to the environment, particularly to the soil. In addition to that, they raised knowledge regarding financial management, which included topics such as insurance policies, the national pension system, digital banking, and cyber security according to the Ministry of Finance, Government of India.

In the afternoon session, the volunteers began cleaning the school by removing the weeds and collecting the plastics and other dry garbage as part of the cleanliness mission. The litters that was collected was separated into biodegradable and non-biodegradable. The valedictory function was held on seventh day with the Headmistress of the, Panchayat Union Elementary School as guest of honor. The event began with an invocation and welcome address by Sr. PO-NSS. Dr T Sukumar gave a comprehensive report on the events that took place during the camp, which included a variety of NSS mission activities. After that, the chief guest continued her address by congratulating the NSS volunteers of the camp and stating that this camp must have added the values that they brought.
